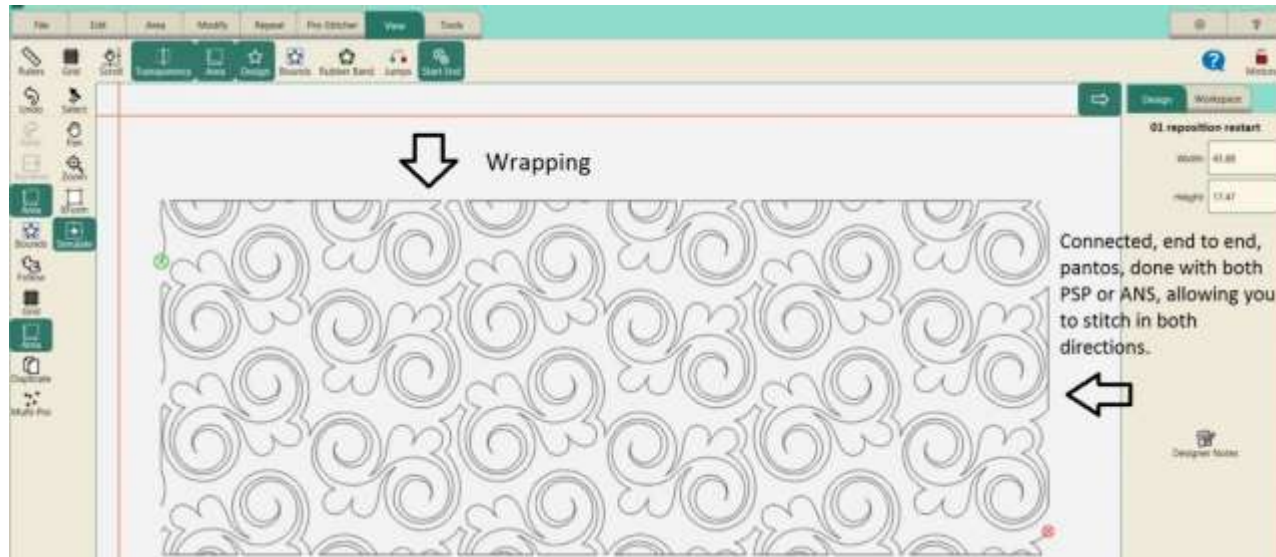

PS Simulation before you even step up to the machine to stitch.

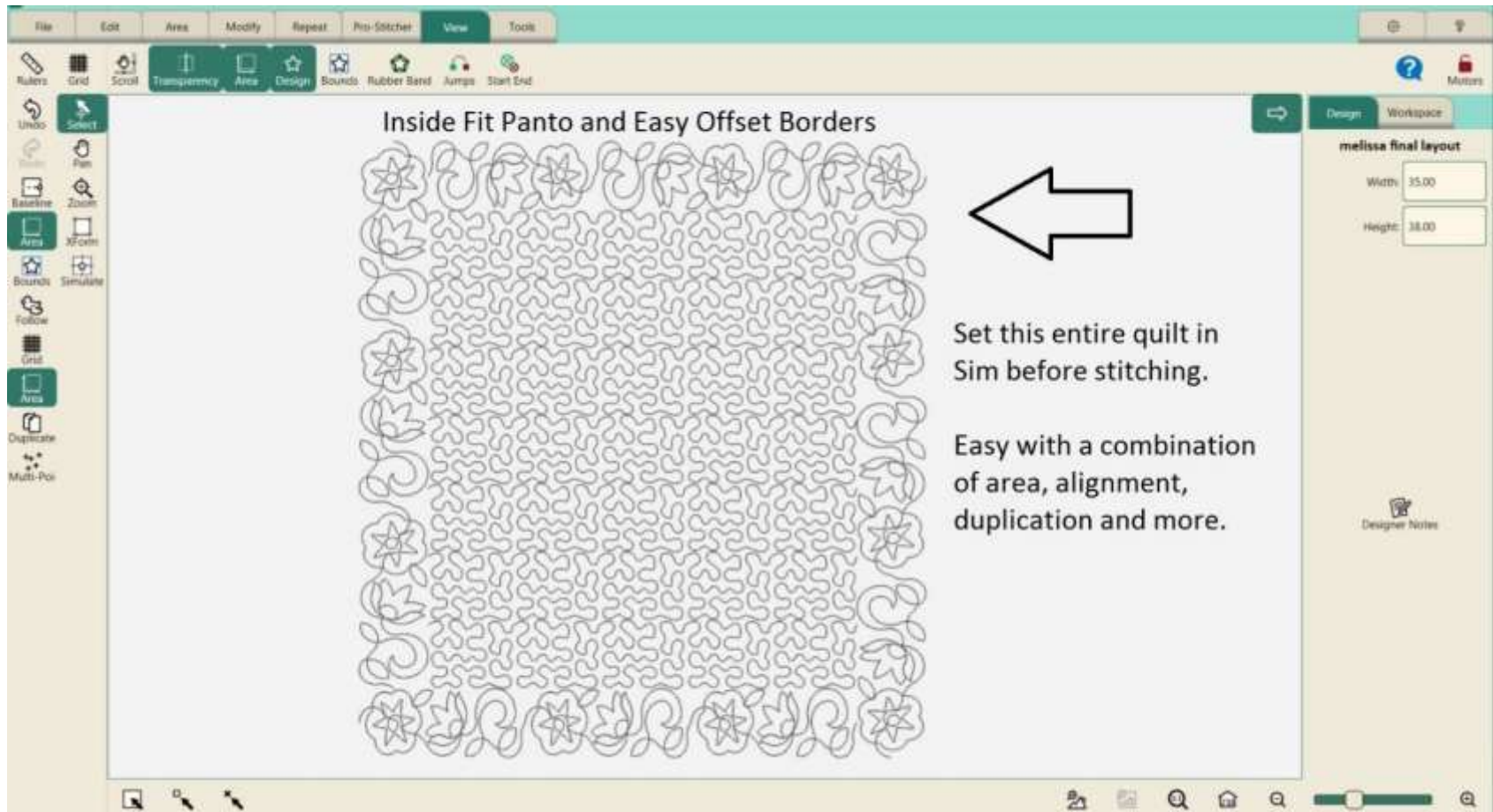
OUTLINE OF INSTRUCTION *Best Practices for Pantos*



We start our day with the MK way of setting Pantos.

Learn pre-sizing and pre-setting pantos. Take it to the next level with wrapping, offset pantos, and my new favorite trick for pantos. Stitching in both directions which works well on MOST pantos.

Next we move into my most popular instruction, by far.

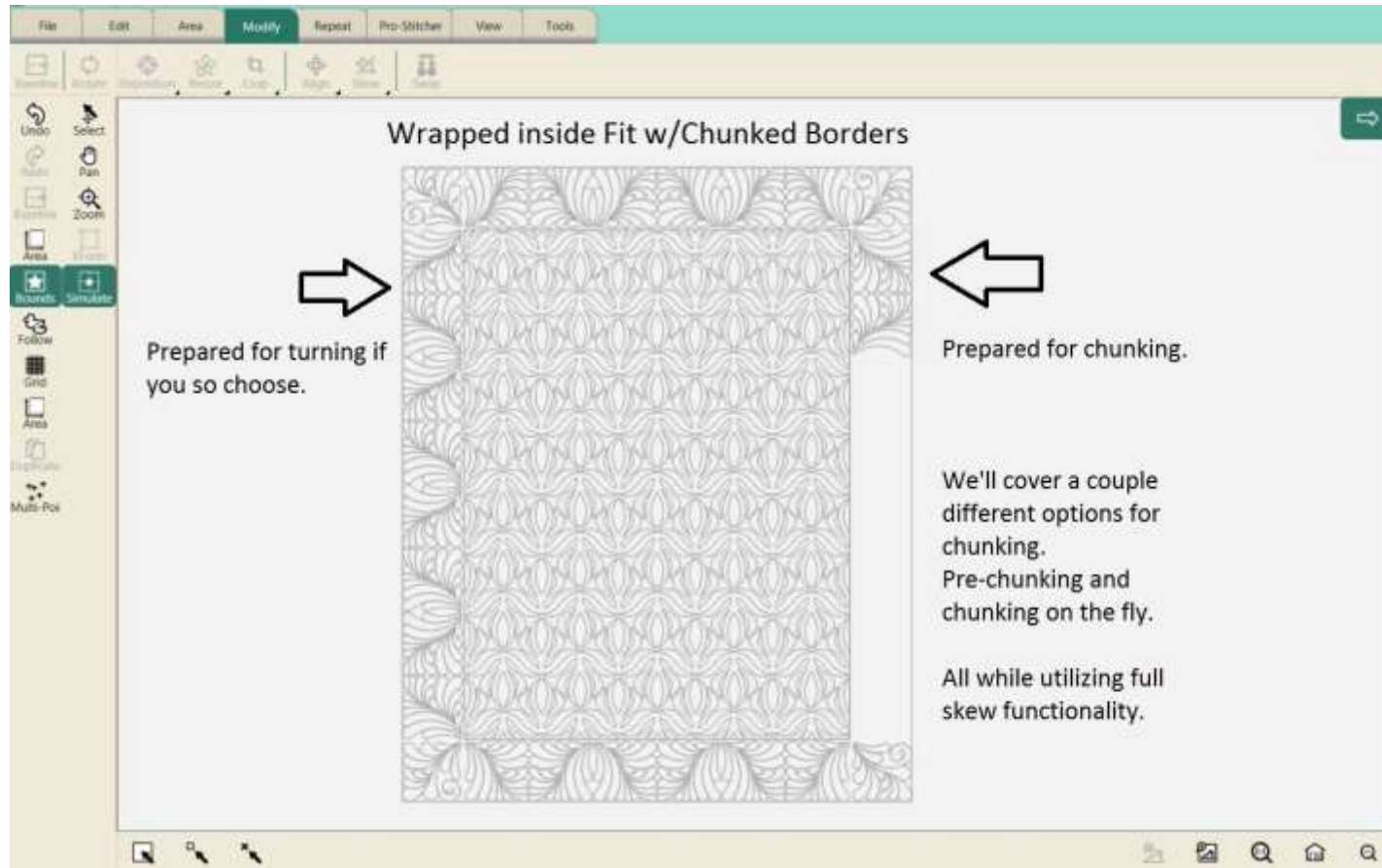
The MK Way of presetting a quilt layout from within Sim.

We start easy, inside fit and easy borders. Learn to check density, pattern compatibility, skew functionality so nothing runs off the quilt or into your seam lines.

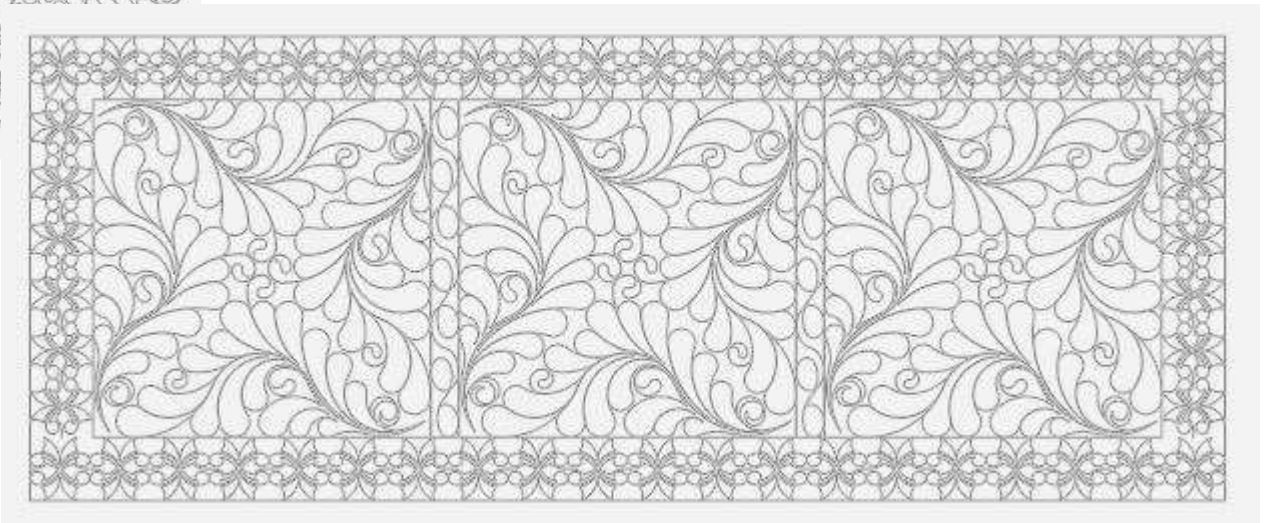
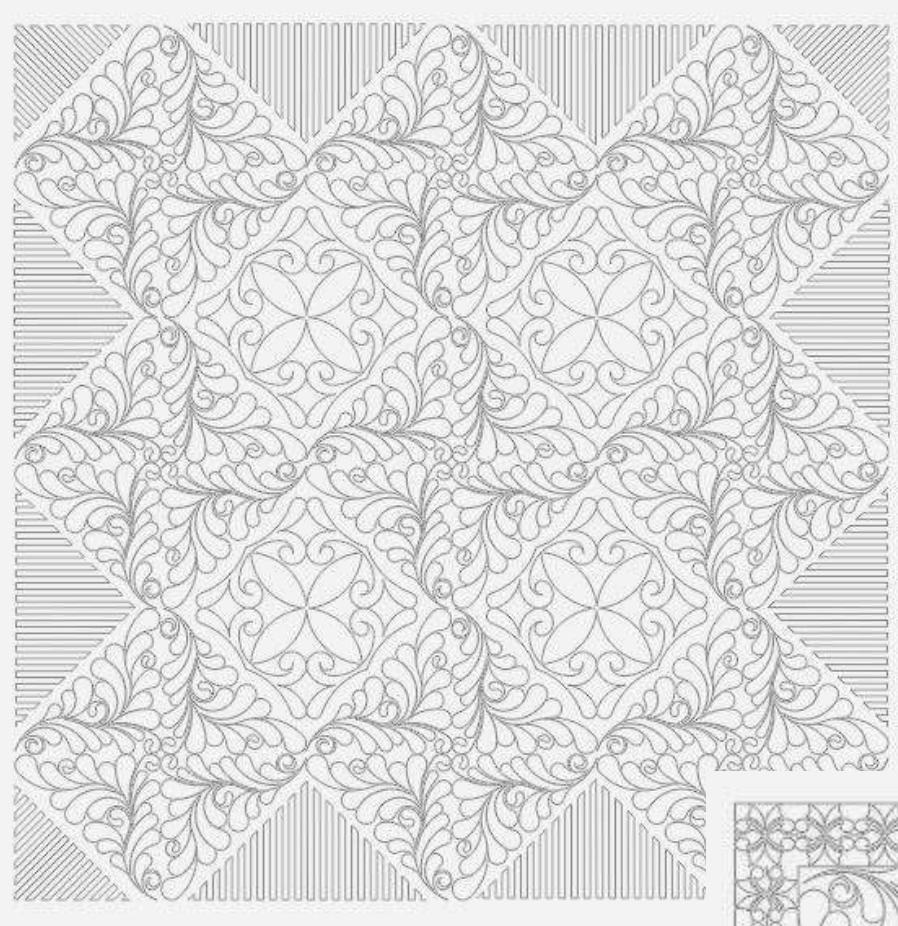
Intermediate Applications

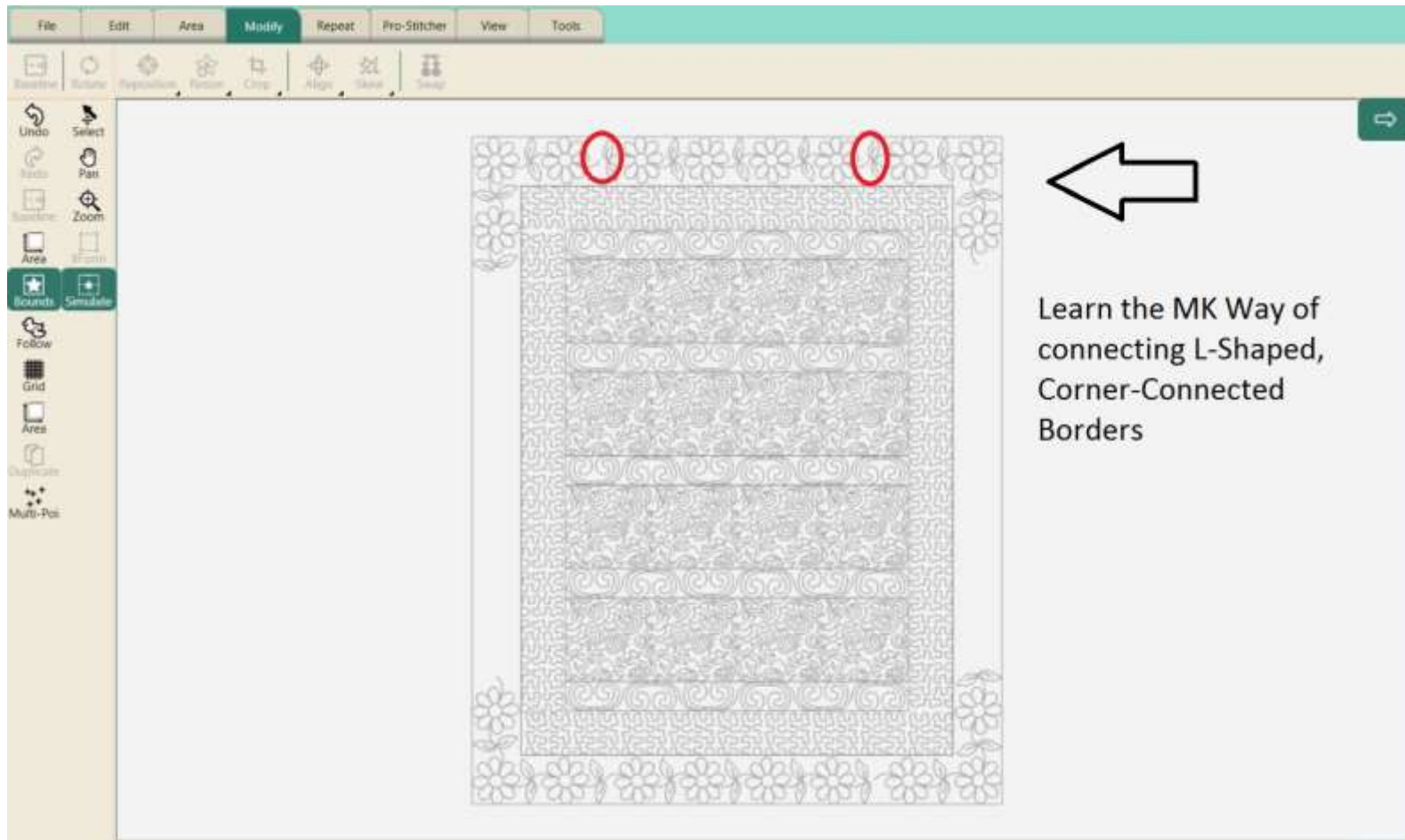

As we continue through the MK Way of setting our quilts using simulation, we cover some mixed layout techniques. Row to row layouts, on point and sashing.



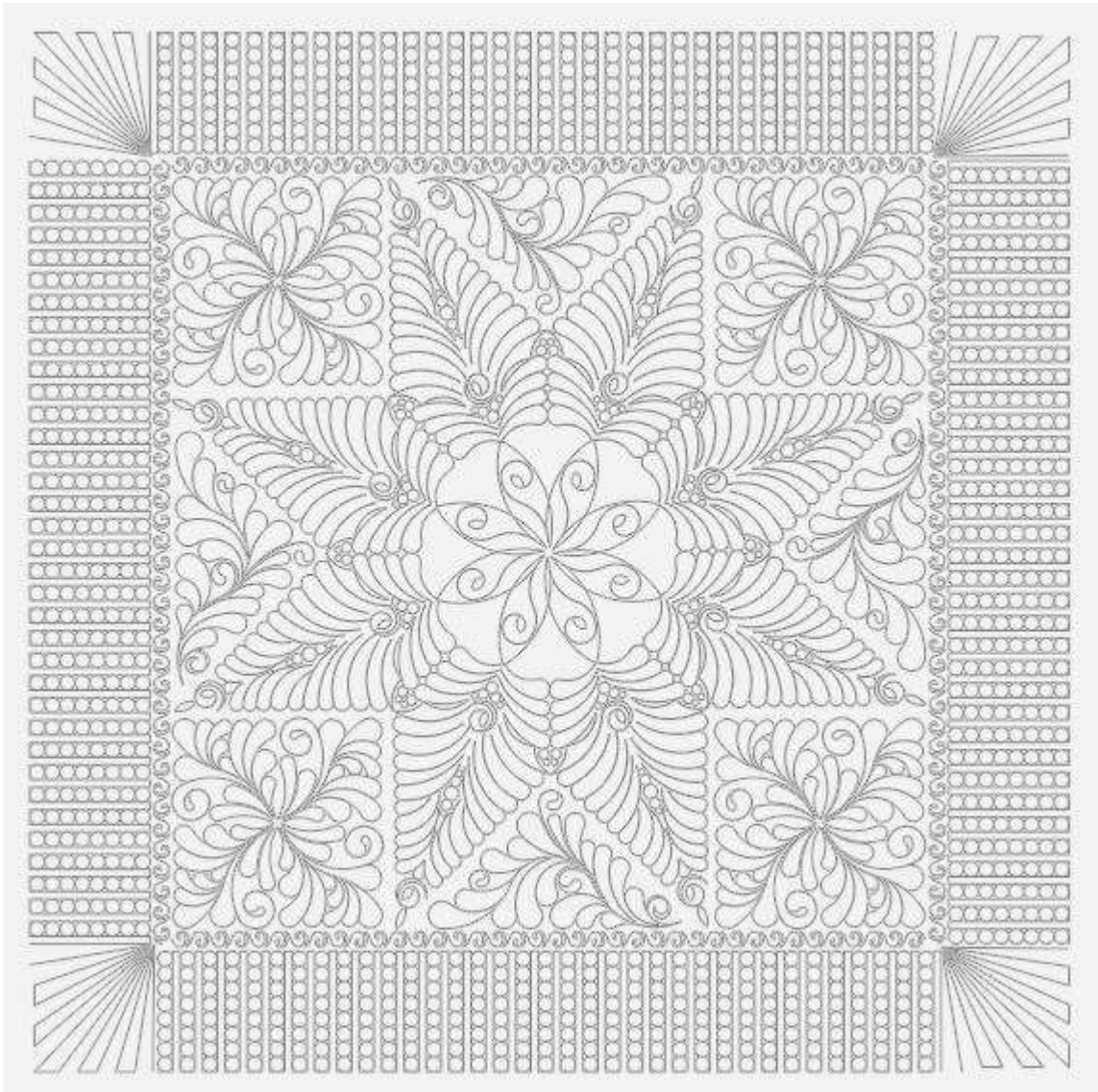
